Autumn Term

I hope that the summer holidays were positive for you all and that the term has started well for your child. The six weeks are always quite busy despite there being no children on site and this year was no exception. There have been a number of additions to the school site, particularly at Park Avenue. Some of you will have noticed a canopy that has been added to the back of the Year 6 block. This not only enables opportunities for Year 6 to learn outside from time to time but it will also give some additional shade in the hot weather (very useful this week!) to all children during break times. We have also had some outdoor gym equipment fitted to enhance the playground experience for the older children. It is good to note that last year's school council helped select these – they can be proud of the influence that they have had here.

I am pleased to say that we have recruited a new caretaker who will be starting later in the half term. The final recruitment checks are taking place and I hope to share more details next week.

However, if you would like your child's profile name to show only the first initial of their forename and full surname please do contact our school office who can action this for you.

Curriculum Meetings

On Wednesday 13th September we will be holding curriculum meetings for parents in Years 1-6 to attend. This is an opportunity to meet your child's class teacher and find out about the learning for the year ahead. For Year 1, these will take place at 2.40pm and 6pm. For Years 2-6 these will take place at 2:50pm and 6pm. For the meetings during school time the children will be out of the classroom with other members of the staff team so that these can take place, however for the evening meetings there will not be staff available to supervise the children so please avoid bringing children along to the 6pm meetings where possible.

We look forward to seeing you all and sharing information about the exciting year ahead.

Hair

It is lovely to see how smart the children have looked coming back to school. We encourage our children to take pride in their appearance by following our school uniform policy which can be found here (<u>https://www.riverbridgeprimary.co.uk/page/?title=Uniform&pid=65</u>).

Children are allowed to wear small stud earrings to school. If these are worn on PE days the children must be able to remove these independently. If they are unable to do this please remove these before your child comes to school. No hoop or long earrings or any other jewellery should be worn.

Children are expected to have their hair styled off of their faces and it is recommended that this is tied up. Hair must be tied up for PE lessons. Any accessories worn in children's hair should be small and blue or neutral in colour. Any Alice bands that are worn should be in royal blue. Children are asked not to have any high fashion haircuts. e.g. 'train-tracks' or 'Mohicans'

Dinner Payment

If your child is in Year 3 - 6 and pays for school dinners, costs for this term are as follows:

£13.75 per week or £93.50 until October half term.

This does not apply to those children that receive benefit related Free School Meals. Payments can be made via your child's Scopay account. Dinners need to be paid for in advance. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

Wraparound Care Payment

We would like to clarify the payment system for Breakfast Club and After School Club. On your child's Scopay account you will see the codes we use for booking your child's place on the calendar. Future bookings are shown as the following: Breakfast Club 'P's; After School Club 'Y' (half sessions), 'Z' (whole sessions). At the end of the week before any sessions, bookings become payable, the codes then change to the following: Breakfast Club bookings 'B' and After School Club bookings 'H' (half sessions), 'W' (whole sessions).
