The team reminded everyone that children should brush their teeth for a minimum of two minutes every day and visit the dentist twice a year.

Abraham Keita Activist

Active Compassionate Connector

In Monday's assemblies, we found out about Abraham Keita from Liberia. He is an activist who is known around the world for standing up for peace and fairness. When he was still a child, Abraham saw problems in his community and decided he wanted to help. He believed that children should have a voice and that young people can help make the world a better place.

In 2015, Abraham Keita won the **International Children's Peace Prize**, an award given to children who work hard to help others and promote peace. He received this prize because of his courage, leadership, and dedication to helping children in Liberia live safer and happier lives.

Abraham encourages young people to speak up, learn about their rights, and treat others with kindness and respect. He



shows that you do not need to be an adult to make a difference — even children can be leaders.

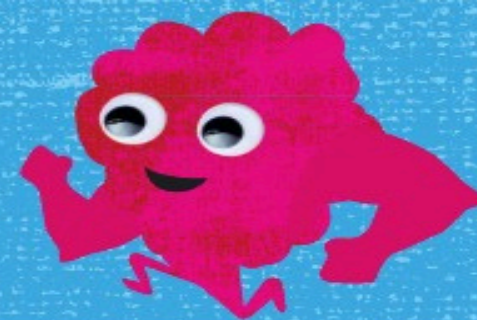

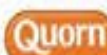

SPONSORED SCOOT

Dear Parents/Carers,

During the week commencing **9 February 2026**, Riverbridge children can participate in a sponsored scoot. This will take place during school time (PE lessons) and will not only be lots of fun but a good opportunity to raise funds for our school.

Each child will complete 5 laps of the Scooter Assault Course. Each lap will present a different challenge appropriate to the age and ability of the child. The course will include:

- A simple lap of the playground
- A lap weaving in and around a series of cones
- A lap with a high bar - children need to pass under without knocking over
- A lap following arrows on a line of tape stuck to the floor
- A lap where balls will be collected and placed in a basket



As the Sponsored Scoot will take place during PE lessons, just send them in on their usual PE day, wearing their PE clothes and let them scoot into action! If possible, children will need to bring their scooters (labelled with their name).

You can sponsor your child by scanning the QR code and paying your sponsorship money online by **Saturday 28th February 2026**). Alternatively, you can complete the sponsorship form attached (the form and sponsorship money should be returned to school by Friday 27th February 2026).

If each child could raise £5 in sponsorship, we could raise almost £3000 towards our £15,000 fundraising target for this school year. The money we raise gets spent on extra resources, specific educational enrichment events for every single school year, and additional IT equipment. We would be grateful for any contribution you can make. Feel free to pass on to family and friends too.
