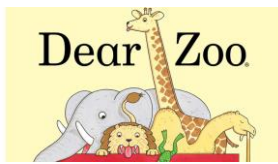
SNOW AND ICEANIMALS

OUTSIDE ACHIEVEMENTS





