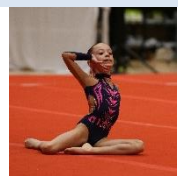

On Monday we found out about Poorna Malavath, an inspiring young adventurer who shows us that big dreams can come true, no matter where you start.

Born in a small village in India, Poorna grew up in a family with very little money. However, she worked hard at school and was given the opportunity to attend a special residential programme that encouraged students to try new challenges.

At just 13 years old, Poorna achieved something incredible—she became the youngest girl in the world to climb Mount Everest, the highest mountain on Earth. Climbing Everest is extremely difficult. It takes strength, courage, and determination to face freezing temperatures, strong winds, and steep, icy paths. Poorna trained for months and never gave up, even when things were tough.

Her achievement reminds us that age does not limit what we can do. With hard work, confidence, and the courage to try, we can all reach our own "mountains" in life—whether that's learning something new, helping others, or achieving a personal goal.
